KICKING OFF PBIS

Start the new school year positively and proactively!

Make sure everyone in the school knows about PBIS, the behavior expectations in all areas and settings, the acknowledgment system, and the consequences for not following the expectations.

PLAN FOR TEACHING EXPECTATIONS

Teaching Behavior Expectations

Be sure that all staff and all students know what behavior is expected in all areas at all times.

- Teach the expectations in all non-classroom areas such as hallways, restrooms, cafeteria, playground, etc.
- Teach the expectations in all settings such as assemblies, before school, after school, field trips, etc.
- Teach expectations in all classroom settings such as independent work, group work, lecture time, etc.
